

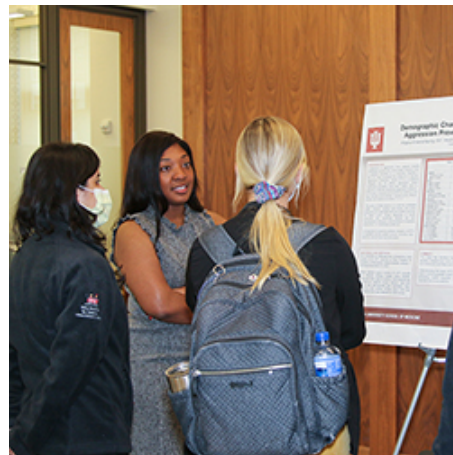


Global Health Faculty Input Sought
